Technical Report (AL)

 The Learn to Train – Under 8 to Under 12 Programming and Technical Director Diploma from BC Soccer was discussed

o BC Soccer is requesting feedback on the attached by October 14th

- Tiering at U11 and U12 is involved
- BCSPL
 - BCSPL is now expecting all BCSPL team head coaches to have their National B qualifications
 - What is the CSA qualification for nationals
 - Coaches who obtain their National B coaching certification have not stayed with the BCSPL program long as they are able to obtain other coaching positions
 - Ben Hooks and Tyler Hughes have gone on to be club technical directors, Steve Simonson and Neil Sedgwick went onto university jobs



- VIPL
 - 9 of the clubs have responded with representatives for the upcoming VIPL subcommittee meeting
 - Andrew and Karen are to attend with an invitation for Director Kennedy to attend also
 - Subcommittee members are to elect a chair and are to run the meeting
 - Andrew and Karen are there only to give advice
- Physical Literacy Workshops
 - Workshop was held on September 30th with approximately 14 participants
 - o Another course will be worked in with the She Kicks program in the spring
- Coaching courses
 - Many clubs are now running their own FUNdamentals and Active Start courses with a good number of coaches obtaining their correct qualifications
- Touches on the Ball U13
 - Andrew discussed his "Ball contact in U13 High Performance Soccer" paper
 - Andrew had a number of Wave players working with him during the Wave intake festival counting touches on the ball
 - There was very little difference between the males and females
 - Another good test would be to have the U12 teams playing 8 aside and counting touches and then compare these players to touches on the ball during the U12 festival in March
 - Other districts including Upper Island have moved forward to keeping U13 at 8 aside on the smaller field
 - Some Lower Island clubs want to stay at 11 aside as the B Cup Representative would get a free ride into the Island berth of the provincials

 - As the VISL uses Team Pages, the problems using this system are already known
 - The LISA referee portion of our website went down several weeks ago and although they kept saying it was our fault, it turned out it was something on their side; once fixed current provider suggested it was time to upgrade our website

 - The quote from Scribe Graphics Inc. to Lower Island Soccer was discussed

Learn To Train – Under 8 to Under 12 Programming & Technical Director Diploma

White Paper

BC Soccer continues to work to better support the membership, their affiliated clubs and most importantly the participants and players within the soccer community in BC.

Early in 2016 the BC Soccer Board of Directors identified two specific areas to gather more information on and work to support better. One, being the programming within the golden age of learning (Under 8 through Under 12) and second, the role of Technical Director.

With this focus, BC Soccer commissioned a third party sport specific consultant (Capitis Consulting) to research and provide an analysis of current soccer programing within the Learn-To-Train stage within BC Soccer affiliated clubs, along with comparison information from similar soccer infrastructures and to research and provide an analysis on the position of the Technical Director. These reports were presented to the BC Soccer Board in April 2016.

Both of these areas are important components to the soccer community's landscape in BC and impact on a large segment of players, therefore it is important to ensure all are aware of the work BC Soccer is planning to undertake over the next 6-12 months in these areas.

Learn-To-Train Soccer Programming and Activities

It was evident within the report that there are a number of clubs within the BC Soccer structure that offer very well structured programming based on the principles of Long Term Player Development, mainly those with full-time paid technical staff. However, the report also highlighted that there are some areas within the soccer community, that only offer basic programming, primarily due a lack of knowledge and/or resources within the club to provide such.

Therefore, with a vision to place greater structure around the Learn-To-Train (U8-U12) stage within Long Term Player Development and provide the appropriate support and guidance to the affiliated clubs and members in BC, BC Soccer will be working to develop the following:

- Under 8 to Under 10 and Under 11 to 12 Grassroots Programing Guidelines.
 These separate guideline documents will set the standards for clubs who wish to development their own curriculum / training model must adhere to.
- Under 8 to Under 10 and Under 11 to 12 Grassroots Programming Curriculum.
 These separate curriculum documents will be for those clubs who don't have the resource to create their own and will be designed to be easily scalable for the club size, available facilities / resources and season length.
- Under 8 to Under 12 License.
 This License will be designed to recognize and support those clubs who are developing players within the recognized BC Soccer player development pathways (grassroots and high

performance stream). Clubs will be able to apply for this License, which will have set criteria that is aligned with principles of Long Term Player Development and the agreed principles within BC Soccer's development environments.

Technical Director

It was clear within this report that Clubs within the BC Soccer community would like more support and guidance as it relates to the role of Technical Director. Therefore, with the desire to better support Technical Directors, potential Technical directors and the affiliate clubs and membership who hired and employee them, BC Soccer will be working to develop the following:

- Clear definition of the role of the Technical Director (and identifying the role of a Club Head Coach / Coaching Staff), including what their main responsibilities should be and the suggested skillset/qualities/experience/certification clubs should look for when hiring a Technical Director.
- A BC Soccer Technical Director Diploma / Certificate.
 This will be a classroom style (lecture and interactive) course focusing more on the non technical items that are expected and required of technical directors. This items include (but not limited to) the following: communication, finance management, governance and board reporting/role, public speaking, etc.
