## **NEW BUSINESS**

### Office Update (KHD)

- Forms, the attached Applications for "Grandparented" Player Status and Intra-Club Youth to Youth Permit were discussed
  - The "Grandparented" form was a good form and needed no further changes
  - The following changes to the Intra-Club Youth to Youth Permit were suggested



- Birthdate to be removed
- Parts of the document did not leave enough room for a person with large print to legibly complete the form so larger spacing was requested
- The forms were approved by the board once the requested changes were made
- Question arose regarding a link to the on line permit system
  - The on-line permit form was never approved by the board
  - All permits must be into the office prior to the start of the match, online permit can be printed
- The attached budget was discussed
  - Format changes made to the budget notes requested by the Presidents at the President's meeting were completed

- Thank you to all board members who attended and helped with the Island Invitations Championship at Lochside

# Technical Report (AL)

- 12 BCSPL players have been asked to Phase 2 of the Provincial Tryouts
- A number of VIPL franchises have asked permission to pool together to put a team into the VIPL U14 Girls league
  - LISA franchises involved would be Bays/Peninsula, Gorge/Lakehill and Juan de Fuca/Sooke
  - They had combined assessments
  - Team would be based out of Gorge as Gorge has the majority of players
  - Last year LISA approved a pooling like to this to allow a U18 Girls team into the VIPL which worked well for all involved, believe this is similar as it is clubs working together at assessments

**Motion:** To allow Bays/Peninsula, Gorge/Lakehill, and Juan de Fuca/Sooke to pool at the U14 Girls level to create a Girls U14 VIPL team by B Nex, 2<sup>nd</sup> J Charlton Carried



- After creating this pooled team there will be three teams representing the Lower Island in this league, Saanich Fusion, Cowichan and the pooled team who will play against two upper island teams for a league of five teams
- On May 26<sup>th</sup>, there will be a VIPL steering committee meeting
  - Technical directors are asked not to attend as they are unable to make decisions for their club
  - A member of club boards are asked to attend and take this discussion back to their next board meeting
  - As a term of reference, LISA has 27 VIPL teams and 35 Bronze teams, TD Latham believes this is a good statistic to show that while some may believe VIPL is not working there are 27 teams in it and we would never give up on 27 teams if they were bronze
  - o Meeting will be held at the Gorge clubhouse starting at 8:00 pm
    - Cowichan will attend this meeting
- On May 28<sup>th</sup> there will be a meeting at the Gorge Clubhouse asking clubs what they are doing to recruit and retain players
  - The U14 and U15 leagues are getting smaller and smaller
- Pre B Course and International Coaching School courses (conflict, leading effectively) are coming up in May

# Scholarships (TH)

- There were 38 applicants for the LISA scholarships
  - o Packages were nicely put together by the office
  - Recipients of the LISA scholarships for this year are Graeme Thompson (JdF), Chloi Cooke (Lakehill), Bilal Mohamed (Highlanders Prospects ((former VI Wave player)), and Ryan Cui (Saanich Fusion)
  - Scholarship forms need revising

## LISA AGM (KHD)

- ED Hood-Deshon passed around a copy of the LISA 2015 AGM booklet
- Awards will not be presented to clubs who promoted players to the BCSPL nor to clubs who hosted tournaments
  - No awards are presented at the request of some clubs as a cost saving measure
- Director Kilbank will present the Youth of the Year Referee award
- Head Coach will present the Coach of the Year award
- President Satterford will present the Executive of the Year award
- President Satterford will present the President's Award

## Other

- BC Soccer AGM
  - President Satterford asked permission to ask questions at the AGM regarding the current voting procedures



- Rumour is that the BCSPL should be their own club
  - It is felt that this will not go through
- The voting system at the BC Soccer AGM is flawed
  - For every youth vote, there are 10 adult votes
  - Adult votes can overturn youth votes by the power of their voting numbers
- On some youth issues, the adults will abstain from voting and vice versa
  - This might not be legal
  - There was at least one instance in recent history when the gentleman's agreement to abstain on youth issues was not done and many youth organizations were not happy with the adult organizations that influenced a vote on a youth issue
- There is a push to 1 club, one vote
- Currently if you are involved in a winter league and a summer league, as they are separate leagues, the same people will have two votes
- Voting procedures might come up at the 2016 BC Soccer AGM
- International transfers have been made harder
  - Currently the age that a player does not need an International Transfer is 12, it is being changed to 10
    - BC Soccer has asked that all districts remind their clubs that playing International players without having an International Player Transfer will have many implications against the club, all field/player insurances are cancelled, coach/player called to discipline and suspended for at least 6 months, etc
- Selecting dates for LISA Cup; Feb 6<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> is long weekend for BC Family Day, Feb 13<sup>th</sup> and 14<sup>th</sup>; U Vic not available so would have to be held over 2 days at PISE, or Feb 20<sup>th</sup> and 21<sup>st</sup>.
  - Board decision is to hold the LISA Cup on February 13<sup>th</sup> and 14<sup>th</sup> at PISE
- Director Farquhar mentioned that Dom Butcher, Technical Director from Lakehill is moving to be a Technical Director at Bays
  - Lakehill are currently working on hiring a new Technical Director

## **World Cup Player Escort Draw**

- 1. Board decision was to have a representative from each club as an escort and the remaining 12 escorts would be drawn from the balance of the applicants
  - An applicant was randomly drawn by board members from each club (10 escorts)
  - Balance of names were placed in a large bag and were randomly drawn by board members completing all escorts

## Application for "Grandparented" Player Status

In order to assist the Club and District Registrars to track players claiming "grandparent" status, each player who desires to claim such status must complete this form and return with it their registration form. The form need only be completed once and, if approved by the LISA Board, the player will retain his/her status until such time as his or her address changes or if "continuous" play with a club is interrupted.

### "Grandparented" players are defined in the Bylaws, Article 13.3, as:

, ,

ii) A player whose place of residence was but is no longer within the boundaries of the club that he or she most recently played for will be granted an exemption to play for that club if since the move the player has not played for any other club.

Under some circumstances you may apply to have a grandparent status reinstated after a time of absence from a club (e.g. playing with BCSPL, parents on posting, extended illness or injury, etc.). This application must be made to the USA office before you commence playing in order that your exemption request can be considered.

Players who wish to claim "grandparent" status must complete the following two sections as well as submit documentary proof of in-catchment during playing time:

#### Intra-Club Youth to Youth Permit

Any club team using a player from one of their lower division teams must ensure that the appropriate permit is completed and handed to the game official & a copy to opposing team before the start of the game. Failure to do so may result in disciplinary action against that team and/or the player involved. A player is allowed to play in unlimited league games in a higher division. Intra-club permits are not allowed in any Cup games.
