Club Reports

- Lakehill
 - AGM was held earlier in May, Jeremy continues to be President
- Juan de Fuca
 - May 23rd is their awards night and June 6th is their AGM
- Prospect Lake
 - Has applied for the BC Soccer \$1,000 female grant again this year
 - Working with UVic is run some of the female only courses
- Bays
 - \circ AGM to be held on June 20th
 - Also received a \$1,000 female grant from BC Soccer, will be running a mother/daughter night in hopes to obtain more female coaches
- Peninsula
 - Held their AGM 3 weeks ago, Mike remains on as President and has several new board members
- Gorge
 - Have had a good season
 - Received their Club Charter 1 status
 - Registration in both the youth and adult leagues are up
 - Working on referee development
 - Currently have no female full field referees
 - Plans to replace turf field in July of 2019
 - At AGM will be asking members permission to borrow up to \$500,000 to help with replacing the turf
 - A verbal quote to replace with the field turf and the caged turf is approximately \$680,000
- Saanich Fusion lights are to put in between July 20th and 30th
 - Booking UVIC fields just in case the lights are not completed
- Sooke
 - AGM was held in April
 - Spring soccer doing really well
- Salt Spring Island
 - AGM was held on April 20th, no change to board members

- Spring league is going and very popular

- Has been a director with BC Soccer for a year
- Most other districts throughout the province face the same challenges as LISA does
 - Associate memberships, levels of play, and registration numbers/finances are all common challenges

BC Soccer President, Kjeld Brodsgaard regarding upcoming AGM

- Current first Vice President is standing for President so there will be an election for president as well as first vice president
- Three women are running as directors, currently no women on the BC Soccer Board
- Discussed the upcoming motions being brought forward 2018 BC Soccer AGM
- Discussed retaining both youth and adult referees
- District/club sizes in the mainland were discussed

Office

- LISA will be chasing all clubs for their Notice to Reader, due 30 days after your AGM
- LISA asking clubs to step forward to host district festivals
- Package for BC Soccer AGM received on May 11th
 - LISA noted areas of interest
 - Relaxing of permit and roster rules
 - Changes to the out of district boundary
 - Terms for elected BC Soccer directors from two years to three years
 - Notice to Reader must be completed by a CPA in public practice
 - Protests can be signed by clubs or organizations, not just team officials
- These motions have all been put forward by BC Soccer, no districts have requested any motions this year
- Short discussion on academies
